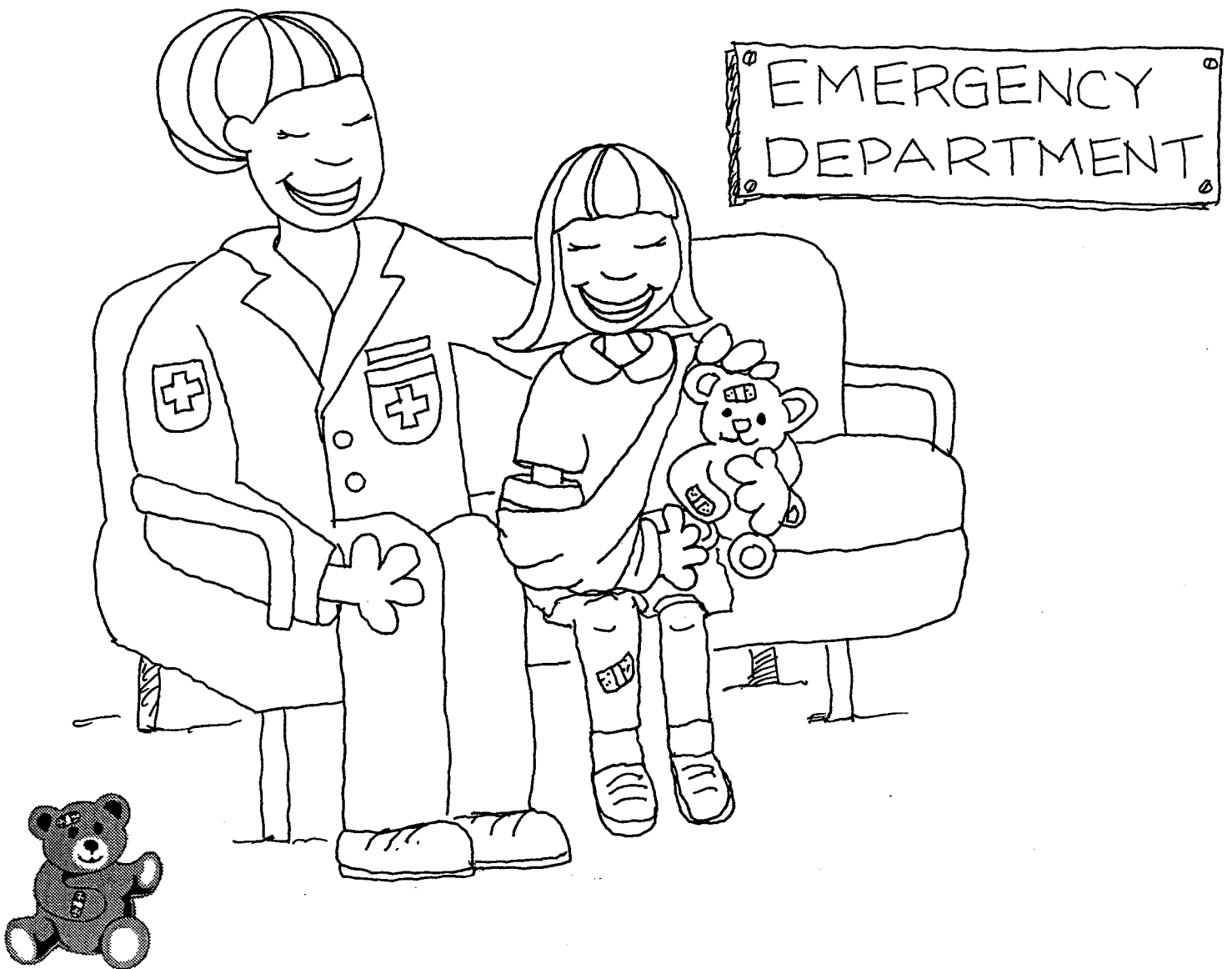

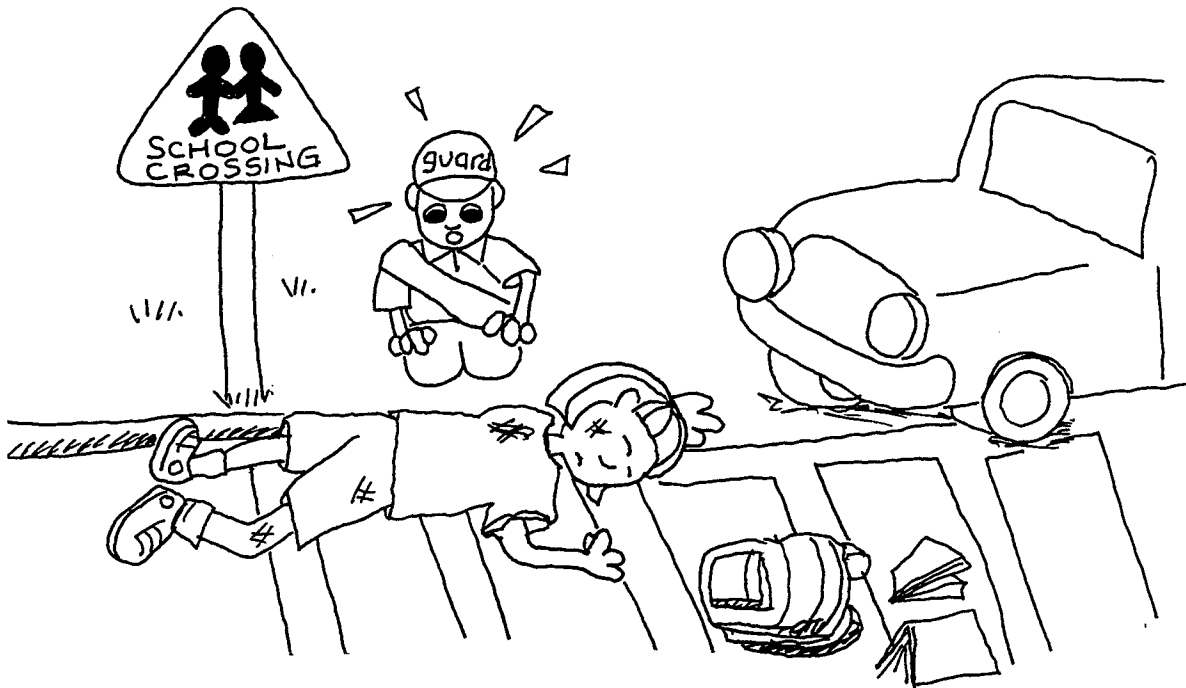

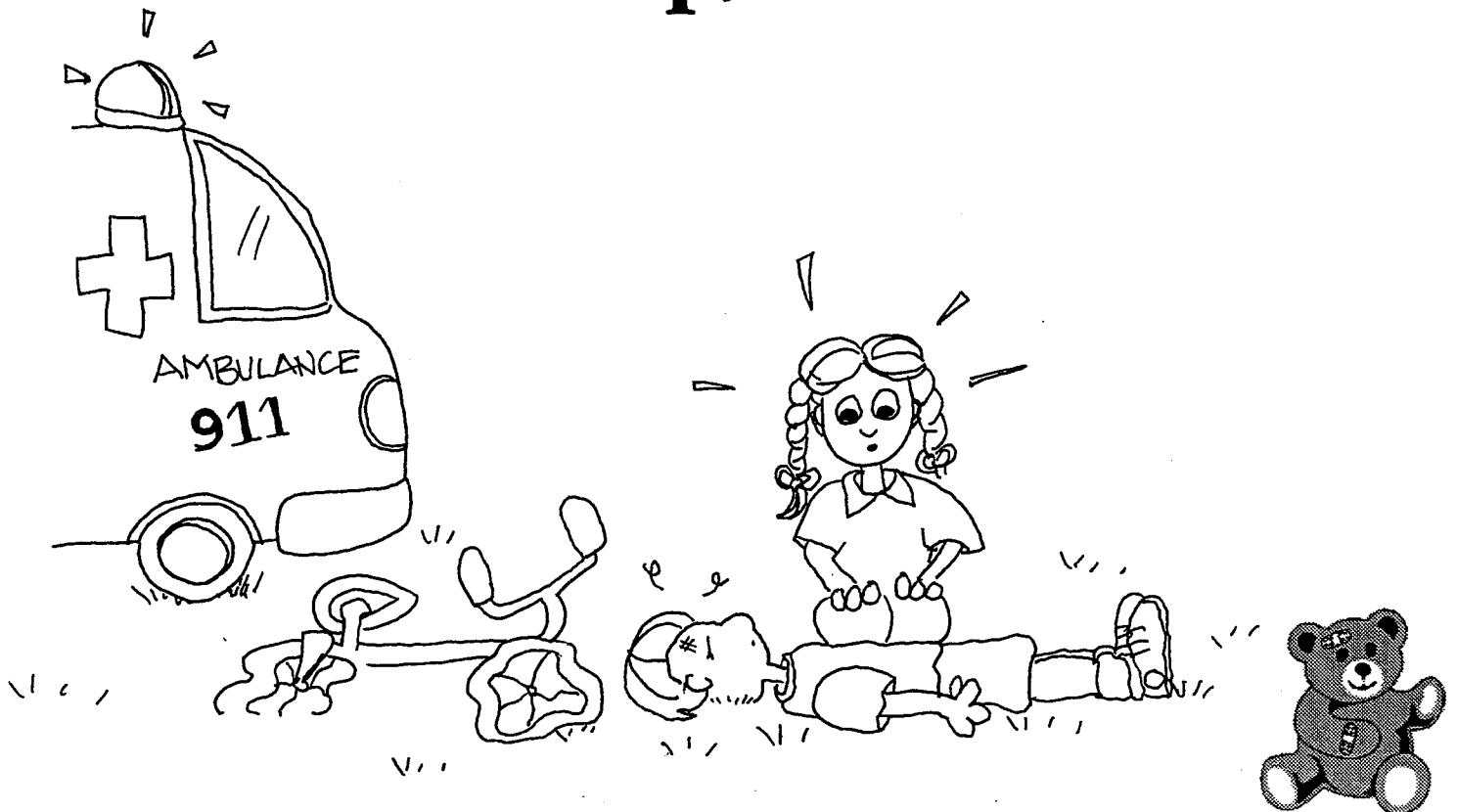
**It can be scary when

when you need help fast.**



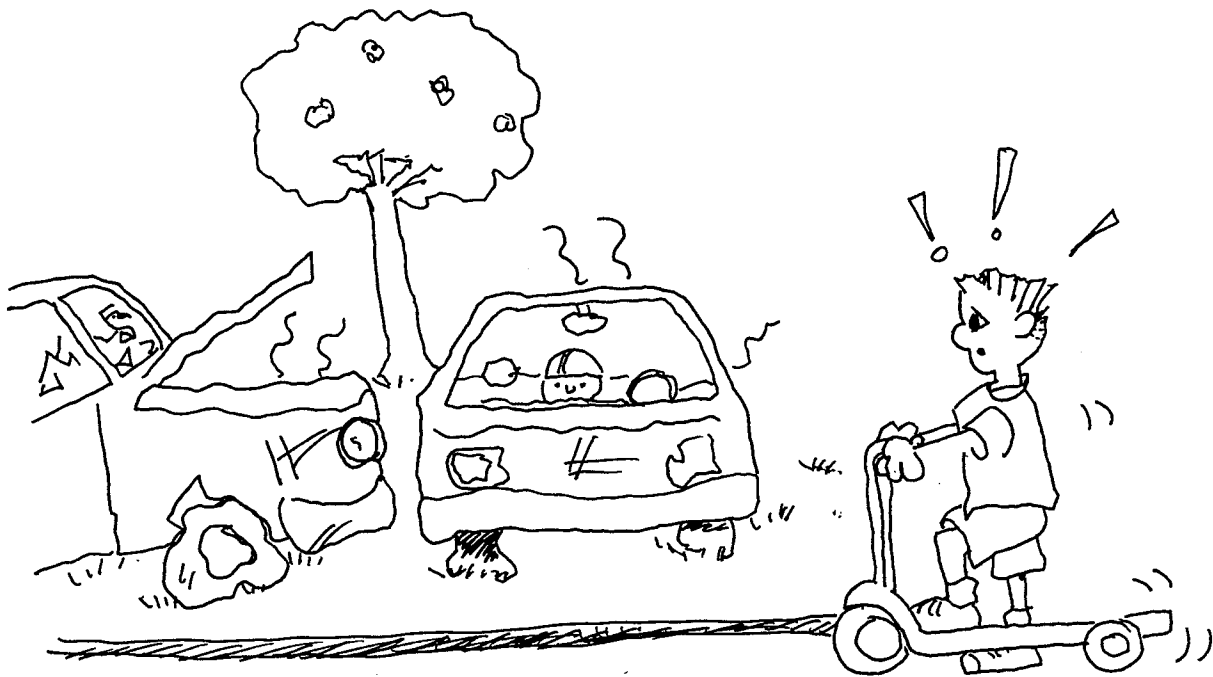
**If you see someone

and needs help, call 911.**



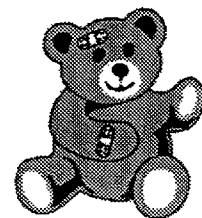
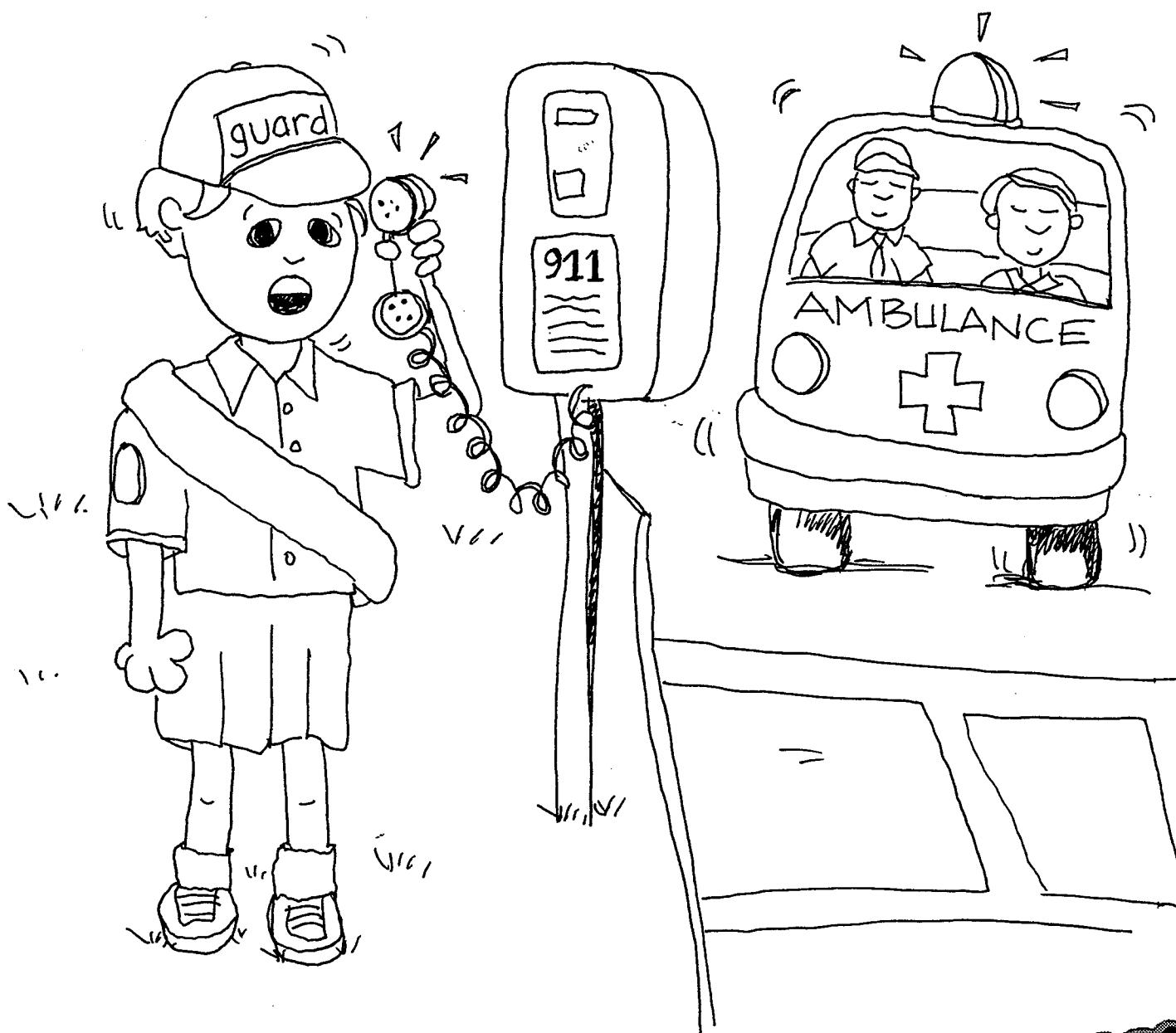
If you see a car crash, call 911.



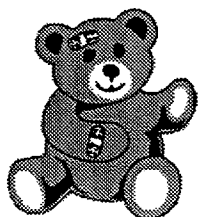
**If you see someone is choking

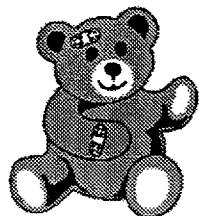
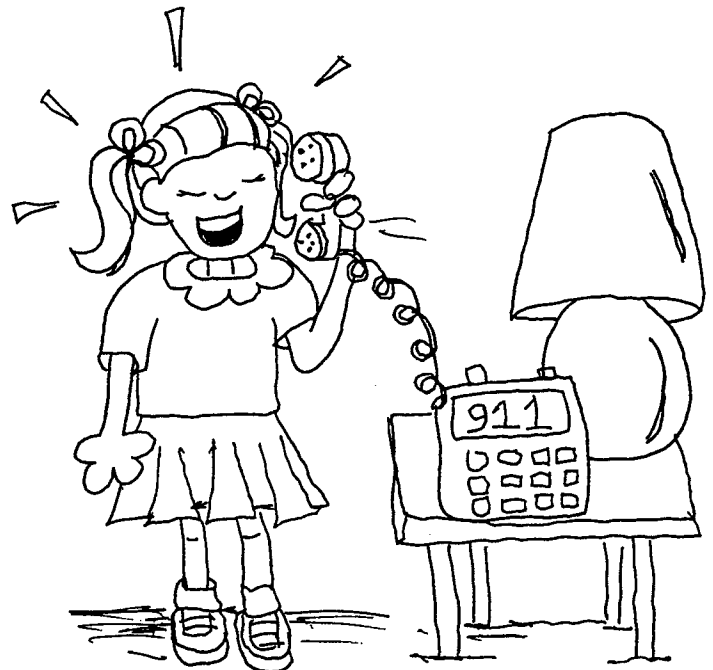
After you call 911, you will be asked questions. Pretend you are at home with an emergency and practice filling in the answers to the questions.

What is your name?

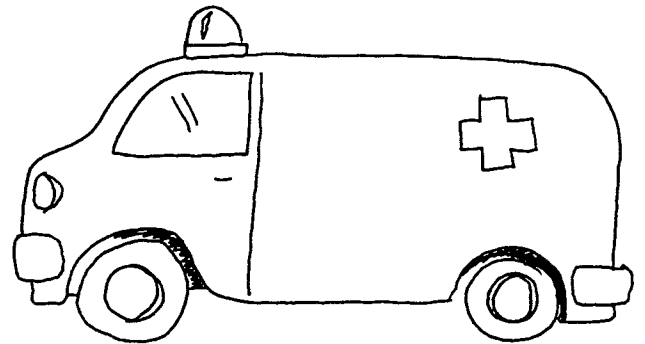

What is the phone number where you are at now?

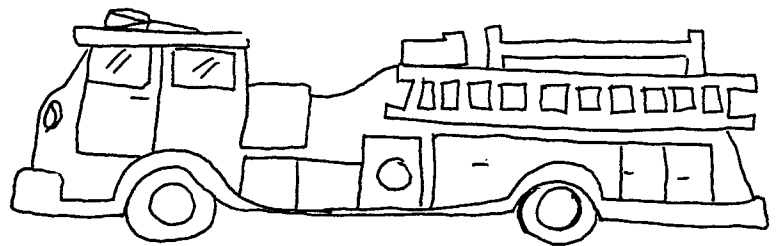
